# November is Native American Heritage Month


The first proclamation for Native American Heritage Month came in 1990 from President George H.W. Bush after Congress passed a resolution that designated November 1990 as National American Indian Heritage Month. Many Natives of this land may be grateful that we have the month of November as Native American Heritage Month, a month set aside to pay tribute to the ancestry, traditions, and contributions of Native Americans.





It is the beginning of a lifetime healing of genocide, betrayal, discrimination, and ill treatment of Native American people. Many Native Americans are deeply rooted in their culture and traditions, which only became legal to practice our lifetime traditions and culture since 1978, when President Carter signed into law the American Indian Freedom Act. Since that time many Native Americans were able to reconnect with their cultural teachings and freely learn and pass down those teachings to the next generation.

"We are very proud of how far the Gun Lake Tribe has come in recent decades. From humble beginnings with only a few key employees, to a fully functioning Tribal Government housed at our beautiful government campus in Bradley, MI, that serves as our Tribal Nation's Capital. Each day, the employees of the Gun Lake Tribal Government and the Tribal Council work toward improving the lives of Tribal Citizens and their families. We are also focused on continuing to provide education and information about the history and culture of the Match-E-Be-Nash-She-Wish Band of Pottawatomi Indians so that these traditions and beliefs may continue to be passed down to future generations." It goes without saying that NAHM is next to Halloween, we remind the community that we are not dressing up in costumes to pretend to be something we are not, we are true Native Americans that embrace our culture, heritage, ancestry and traditions. We invite our community to cross the street and get to know us better, especially during this month recognized as Native American Heritage Month.

# Beginning to Code


