Brenner Outstanding Teacher Award

The Katheryn Lorraine Brenner Outstanding Teacher Award for 2022-2023 school year was presented to Jill Terrell, Media Teacher & Literacy Coach at Pine Street Elementary.



The award was established in 2003 by former WUS Superintendent, Bob Brenner and his wife, Sandy, in honor of their daughter Kathy, and recognizes an outstanding teacher who has committed the extra time and effort to benefit students in the classroom and/or in extracurricular activities within Wayland Union Schools.

The awards were presented at the end of the year staff celebration. Recognized accomplishments were retirees, anniversary years of service and the Brenner Award.

New Inductees to WUS Alumni Hall of Fame

Wayland Union Schools inducted new members into the Wayland Union Schools Alumni Hall of Fame on April 18, 2023. New inductees included Jennifer Moushegian, Vicki Schwartz, and Donald Shafer. Shafer was inducted into the Alumni Hall of Fame posthumously.



Jennifer Moushegian graduated from Wayland Union High School in 1989. From there she attended the University of Michigan where she graduated from the School of Education in 1994. Moushegian later went on to attend Western Michigan University to earn her Master's in Athletic Administration. Moushegian's educational background started at Otsego Public Schools where she was a teacher, then Assistant Principal at the Middle School, and a Middle School Girls Basketball and Volleyball Coach from 1995 to 2002. She became the Assistant Principal for WUMS in 2003 and later became the Principal for Pine Street Elementary from 2008 to 2019. She has served Wayland Union Schools in many capacities over the years, we thank Jennifer Moushegian for her years of dedication to this district.

Vicki Schwartz graduated from Wayland Union Schools in 1971. She later went on to receive her bachelor's degree in Physical Education and Business from Western Michigan University in 1981. Schwartz was an Adult Education Teacher for many years, while also serving as the JV Volleyball Head coach in the 1980s and 90s. Schwartz led very successful Volleyball and Softball programs with the assistance of Coach Anguilm and Coach Sharon. The community will recognize Vicki from Wayland Hardware and Rental Center, which she has owned since 1992. Vicki Schwartz has contributed to many school programs by advertising and touching the lives of many over the years as a coach, teacher, and employer.

Donald Shafer was a proud Wayland Union Alumni. After completing school, he went on to join the Army from 1941 to 1945. After serving in World War II, Donald along with a few local servicemen, formed and built the VFW located on South Main St. In 1946, Mr. Shafer was also a member of the committee to start the first little league program in Wayland. In 1947, Shafer was married and went on to have 5 children, all of whom also graduated from Wayland Union Schools. He was a local builder most of his life, but served on the City Council from 1967 to 1977 and was the elected mayor from 1977 to 1985. Shafer volunteered in many programs throughout the community, making a lasting positive impact on Wayland.

Oustanding People for Education

Being nominated twice, by a staff member and a parent, it's easy to see why Cierra Onken is an outstanding person in education.

Dawn Stein: Executive Administrative Assistant, Administration Office

It is difficult to articulate all that Dawn Stein does to keep Wayland Union Schools running behind the scenes. She is a huge advocate for all staff and students, always keeping what is in the best interest of everyone at the heart of her work. Dawn is the first person that families interact with when enrolling in the district, in which she provides a welcoming environment and a strong knowledge base to set the students up for success. Dawn is also a huge resource for all the secretaries within the district, and a tremendous source of support for the Wayland Board of Education and Central Office team. Wayland is extremely lucky to have such an Outstanding Person for Education within our district.

Chris Teller: Fine Arts Center Director, Wayland Union High School

Chris Teller is the definition of a team player. He consistently comes in early and stays late to make sure all Fine Arts performances are memorable. He is extremely knowledgeable with lighting design and an amazing sound engineer. He also works closely with high school students to pass on his knowledge of lighting, sound, stage, and streaming. Wayland is incredibly lucky to have someone that works so hard to make sure students, staff, and community members have wonderful experiences within the Fine Arts Center.



City of Wayland Partnership

During this previous school year, members of Wayland Union High School partnered with the City of Wayland to form a Junior DDA program. The goal of the program is to allow the community's youth to create spaces within Wayland that are meaningful to them.

Junior DDA members are current members of LOC Club at the high school, advised by Karen Iehl. The project the group took on this past year was revamping the mini park area next to McDuffs. Students opted to add lights, a fire pit, and hammocks. The goal is that each year the group will pick one improvement they'd like to see, do some reasearch, pitch the idea to the Junior DDA board, and then install the project.

Other partnerships with the City of Wayland include Little Miss and Mister, Art for Art Hop, FUTURES programing, and real life marketing experience.

Little Miss and Mister was a drawing competition for first through third grades at Wayland. Each student received a blank piece of paper and had to draw 'What Wayland Means to Me" on it.

For Art Hop this past year, City of Wayland partnered with the elementary schools and art teachers to have each grade create a large winter-themed mural which was displayed at the Fire Station during Art Hop. This is going to become a continued tradition each year, adding different elements and age groups.

A FUTURES program, which WUHS hosts the last week of school, went downtown to plant flowers, fill planters with soil, lay stones, and plant bushes.

A Small Business class is working with Josh Otto at the Wayland Hotel Bar and Grill to learn about real-life small businesses, marketing, and more.

The City of Wayland has 3 other partnership opportunities in the works that will start next year. They involve working directly with students and teachers in hopes of providing real world experiences by partnering with downtown business owners in areas of marketing, development and more.

Wayland Union Schools is thrilled about the new partnership and programing oppportunities being created with the City of Wayland.

Coaches vs Cancer




