# **Introduction to Production**

### **Course Description:**

This one trimester course is for students who have an interest in furthering their knowledge of the craft of theatre including, but not limited to: acting, directing, scriptwriting, dramaturgy, producing, set design, costume design, lighting, sound, publicity, makeup and props. The main assessment of this class is a performance for local elementary schools, and the majority of the class structure is devoted to accomplishing this task. This class is a theater credit, and will require both memorization and performance. All interested students grades 9-12 may enroll.

## **Course Objectives:**

This course is designed to give students a "real life theatre experience". It allows all students within the class to work together to create a full-scale performance with an audience. The class also reads a contemporary play, researches major plays and designs basic technical aspects of theatre.

#### **Course outline:**

- 1. Study and explore the various components necessary to create a full production.
- 2. Research a major play and present information to class.
- 3. Write, produce and perform a series of children's plays from local elementary school students.

## Student Objectives:

- 1) Create a performance for a non-peer audience.
- 2) Research and discover many aspects of the technical theatre.
